Roger Foley is a photographer specializing in landscape architecture and garden design. His commercial work is featured in magazines and newspapers, on his clients' web sites and in hundreds of books. He is the sole photographer of seven garden books, two of which have won 'Award of the Year' from the Garden Writers Association. Roger's latest award-winning book, *A Clearing In The Woods: Creating Contemporary Gardens*, presents twenty-six gardens by noted landscape architects and designers across the country. He also lectures and gives workshops on landscape and garden photography.
